Welcome to the fourth edition of the Blindwells and Longniddry Newsletter. I know many of us will be looking forward to the longer day light and spring bulbs appearing, but we can't let this issue slip by without reflecting on the amazing festive provision in the area.

From the start of August community representatives from Pennypit Trust, resilience groups, churches, third sector organisations and Connected Communities met to plan support for families and adults in the area over the festive period. This included Christmas Presents from Cash for Kids Mission Christmas, Winter Jackets, Christmas and New Year Food bags and plated meals.



Across Preston Seton Gosford we supported
145 Winter Jackets, children of 300 families
and 100 socially isolated individuals in
Preston Seton Gosford. We attracted over
£10,000 from local organisations and
businesses including Reuse Scotland,
Bellway, Hargreaves, Siemens, Inchcape,
Seagreen, Tartan Army Coop, Scotmid,
Chalmers Church, Lighthouse, Longniddry
and District Rotary Club, Gladsmuir &
Longniddry Parish Church, Longniddry
Community Council, Prestonpans
Community Council and Cockenzie and Port
Seton Community Council.

We also know many members of our community contributed financially through donations or indeed handing in selection boxes, chocolates, toiletries, and other items. Problems can be reported on the ELC website, or by phone, so the dog wardens can take action.



Ageing Well

Much has been done in recent years to get East
Lothian more active, but the number of adults
meeting physical activity recommendations
declines sharply with age. Physical activity helps
prevent and manage a wide range of health
conditions, including diabetes, heart and lung
conditions and osteoporosis. But did you know
that less than a third of people in Scotland aged
over 55 are active enough for health?

The Ageing Well project promotes healthy lifestyles for older adults in East Lothian. The project is a partnership between NHS Lothian and East Lothian Council.

The Ageing Well project aims to maintain and promote the physical and mental health, wellbeing and quality of life for older adults in East Lothian through a list of activities.

Some ways Ageing Well can help are:

·Set up new activities where there is a demand or a gap

·Help sign post you to activities in your area
·Help you stay healthy and active for longer
·Work with people who have physical disabilities,
mental health needs or dementia and possibly
"buddy" people to appropriate health-related
services

·Provide advice and training on physical activityrelated topics to organisations and groups working with older people

- We seek the views of tenants and residents on various issues, so we often hold events/consultations to find out what people think.
- We provide training and information sessions to assist groups to influence local issues.
- We also help groups link up on issues that are common to the groups.
- We have a range of practical assistance, such as stationery, photocopying, transport and childcare that local groups who are members can access.
- We offer Public Liability Insurance for our TRA members. Membership is free.
